## Signs to signal area's attractions

TOURIST signs promoting attractions in Yancheep Two Rocks have been installed along Marmion Avenue between Butler and Yancheep.

Last month, Wanneroo Council approved a proposal for the signs put forward by Yancheep Two Rocks Tourism Network as part of the "Rediscover Yancheep" initiative.

Capricorn Village Joint Venture set up the initiative.

Funding will eventually be gained from the signs under two-year sponsorship deals to provide a revenue stream for the network to start promoting tourism in the area.

The tourism network will maintain the signs.

It will also pay for them to be moved when Marmion's second carriageway is built.
